Gerald L'Ange. Urgent Imperial Service. South Africa Forces in German South West Africa 1914-1915. Johannesburg. Ashanti Publishing 1991 1st Ed. 352pp author's note, 13 maps, 137 b&w photos & illus., index, endpaper maps. South Africa's entry into WW1 was surreptitious for without consulting Parliament the government of General Botha committed the country to fighting for the British against the Germans in South West Africa a decision that split the nation still not out of the anguish of the Boer War igniting an armed rebellion that came close to civil war. Once the rebellion was put down Boer and English united to fight the Germans. This is a detailed account of a successful campaign largely overlook by historians. **£10.**

Edwin P Hoyt. Guerilla: Colonel von Lettow-Vorbeck and Germany's East African Empire. Macmillan Publishing. New York. 1981. 1st Ed. V Fine . In the summer of 1914 von Lettow-Vorbeck commanded the German Protective Force in German East Africa, about 2,000 strong and mostly native Askaris. Refusing to surrender to the British he trained this force to become one of the most effective guerrilla forces in history. In 1917 von Lettow estimated that the British Empire had 130 generals and 300,000 troops bumbling around East Africa attempting to defeat his small force. **£10.**

Brian Gardner. On to Kilimanjaro. The Bizarre Story of the First World War in East Africa. Macrae Smith Company. Philadelphia. 1963 1st Ed. V Good. This account of the war in East Africa abounds in tales of bravery adventure, inland sea battles (think African Queen!) and even humour. Guerrilla warfare over a 1,000 miles of desperate bush country plagued by disease and insects both sides showed magnificent heroism and endurance although the commanders of the Empire forces were dogged by shocking mistakes in judgement and military and tactical blunders. **£10**

Account of a practically forgotten campaign of World War One, in which forces of the Union of South Africa successfully invaded the territory of German South West Africa - without assistance from Imperial Britain. 180 pages; maps, index. **£10**

Copy of 1921 original. 238pp with one map and 22 b/w photos This is an unofficial record of the campaign in E Africa, based partly on a diary kept by the author and written up at irregular intervals but by far the greater part has been written entirely from memory. **£5**
